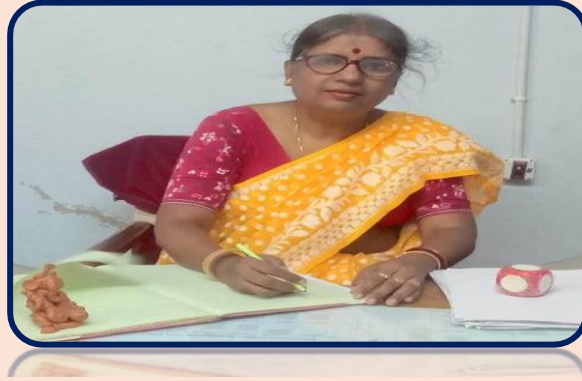

BRIEF HISTORY:

Swami Dhananjoy Das Kathiababa Mahavidyalaya was established in 2009 with the objective of making higher studies accessible to the underprivileged sections of society. The college has played a seminal role in encouraging the youth of Bhara and its adjoining villages to enroll for higher studies. Located in the remote village of Bhara, roughly about 20 kilometres from the tourist town of Bishnupur, in the district of Bankura, the college is an outcome of the earnest endeavour of the local administration and eminent members of the village community. Named after the 56th Acharya of the Akhil Bharatiya Nimbarka religious sect the institute has a pan-Indian association in terms of its affiliation with the Kathiababa trust and foundation. Disciples from both home and abroad have contributed to its infrastructural development and academic enrichment.

Classes were initially conducted in the adjacent High School and the first batch of students added to a total of 71 in 2009. In the following year in 2010, classes formally began at the college premises. Since then, the infrastructure of the college has evolved and there has been a simultaneous increase in student strength. The alumnus of the college has been absorbed into various branches of higher education and they have exhibited a strong commitment towards career development and personal growth.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE:

From 2022-2023 academic session Centralized Admission has been implemented at the UG level which will be moderated by the university with which the college is affiliated. There will be a centralized portal which will be controlled by the Higher Education Council. Admission will be strictly on the basis of merit and students will have multiple colleges to choose from. The cut off marks decided by the college and other subject related information will be available on the centralized portal.

Post publication of plus two results all successful candidates are eligible to apply for online registration for Honours and Programme Courses offered by the college through the centralized portal. Prospective students are also encouraged to consult the college website for additional information www.bharacollege.in . Last H.S. academic year to be considered for admission 2020, subject to one percent deduction per year from 2022 as per Bankura University Guidelines. For admission in Honours Courses it is prerequisite to have 45 percent in aggregate on the basis of best of five subject scores. In case of Geography and Sanskrit Honours the candidate must have these two subjects as part of their HS curriculum.

Reservation for PWD, ST, SC, OBC-A, OBC-B will be as per State Govt. norms.

COLLEGE RULES AND REGULATIONS

- Candidature will be cancelled if the candidate fails to meet registration and enrolment deadlines posted on the college website.
- No student will be allowed to enter the college premises without the college ID Card.
- All fees that are due will have to be cleared within the stipulated date.
- Meritorious students will be awarded the Kathiababa Scholarship on the basis of academic performance, attendance in class lectures and income certificate verified by the SDO/BDO/competent authority.
- All ST, SC, OBC-A, OBC-B students are eligible for Govt. grants and fellowships only if their attendance is above 75 percent.
- If a student misbehaves or is guilty of unethical behaviour within the college premises legal action will be taken against him or her.
- Freeship will be awarded to selected needy and meritorious students.
- Underprivileged and needy students who show a steady academic progress will receive aid from Student Aid Fund.

- Any kind of damage done to college property including library books, laboratory equipments, notice board and the college infrastructure in general may lead to strict punishment and even suspension.
- Admission procedure for first semester will be conducted solely through online procedure, adhering to the admission rules and regulations as specified under the CBCS system of Bankura University.
- All information regarding admission rules and regulations will be available on the college website (www.bharacollege.in) and centralized admission portal
- Please read the rules carefully before filling up the admission form. The candidate will be responsible for any error committed while filling up the form and his/her admission may stand cancelled on account of wrong information provided with particular reference to H.S. result.
- While filling up the Registration form please carefully insert the registered mobile number and mail-id. All information regarding USER ID PASSWORD and MERIT LIST will be communicated via SMS.

ACADEMIC CALENDAR:

Students are advised to follow the college website (www.sddkm.in) and the college notice board regularly, for up to date information regarding class schedule, university registration, form fill up, study leave, exam schedule, and list of holidays.

VIRTUAL CLASSROOMS AND REMOTE TEACHING

As we are well aware post the Covid-crisis there has been a significant emphasis on virtual modes of teaching-learning, remote teaching and development of e-resources. Swami Dhananjay Das Kathiababa college has done the needful in this respect upgrading its software and installing the ERP system to enable virtual learning. The college web page has a portal for e-resources, academic material and modular presentations which students can easily access. Faculty members use assistive apps such as google classroom to distribute study matter and collect assignments. These virtual interactive forums have ensured a smooth transmission of knowledge in the absence of offline classroom teaching. In the post-Covid era the college intends to practice a blended mode of teaching balancing between online and offline modes of interaction.

TEACHING METHODOLOGY

All faculty members are well versed in their respective fields. Continual up-gradation of knowledge through participation in orientation programs, refresher courses and workshops, enable faculty members to remain updated, and to impart education that matches contemporary standards.

The Geography lab is well equipped with all the latest equipment and digital facilities.

Students of literature and other disciplines are exposed to e-learning via digital mediums. The college has the necessary gadgets to show on-screen adaptations of literary texts and enable multi-media interactions.

Apart from these debates, quizzes, student seminars are regularly organized to impart the necessary soft skills to students. A short term *Spoken English* course was introduced in the year 2019 to expose students to basic linguistic skills and elementary grammar.

At present the college in alignment with the requirements of Bankura University follows a semester system(Choice Based Credit System) and promotes a systematic evaluation program based on internal assessments and projects.

COLLEGE LIBRARY



The College is equipped with a spacious library which has a sizeable collection of books and newspapers and informative magazines and journals concerning career management. The library is managed by Librarian Smt Payel Shee and Library Assistant Shree Anup Kr Ghosh. Students avail of the resources in the library and spend time in the reading area for gathering information on various aspects of their study. The library apart from circulating academic material also houses magazines which provide information regarding various job vacancies. Apart from the Central library, Departmental library resources are also provided in case of some subjects. In future departmental libraries will provide more specialized literature and study material on subject specific topics.

LIBRARY RULES

Once admitted in the first semester, the student will be provided with a library card issued from the office. On producing this card the student will be permitted to borrow a maximum of three books from the library. Book issue and return facilities are operative on six days of the week. The borrowed books can be kept for a maximum of fifteen days. Failure to return the books on time will entail a fine calculated on a daily basis. Prior to form fill up for every semester it is mandatory to return all books borrowed. The college also provides internet access to students for accessing e-resources. At present the college has four desktops which can be accessed for reference work.

ADDITIONAL FEATURES DURING PANDEMIC TO FACILITATE CIRCULATION OF RESOURCES

- International Webinar organized on “Role of College Libraries during Pandemic”

- **Ask the Librarian**: Students can communicate with the Librarian directly over **Whats App**, sending book requisitions as required
- Hard copies circulation prior to semester exams. This facility has been operative during the pandemic keeping in mind those students who lack digital devices and smart accessibility.

NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS: UNIT-I):



The NSS Unit of the college recruits **hundred students from each year** and engages them in **various social projects to raise community awareness**. It thus instills an ideal of service in youthful minds. Various events such as **Blood Donation Camp, Nirmal Bangla Avijan and Legal Awareness Camp, Village level Survey** are organized to involve students in social welfare. The NSS played a crucial role in spreading awareness on issues pertaining to health and hygiene during the pandemic, raising awareness about **the use of masks, sanitizers and highlighting need for social distancing** to check the transmission of the virus. **Posters were circulated as visual aids to generate community awareness regarding Covid.**

- On the 2nd of April, 2022, the NSS unit of the college under the supervision of NSS Officer Shree Bipul Chandra Mandal organized a cleanliness drive covering the campus premises and its adjoining areas.
- A blood donation camp was organized on the 17th of June 2022 as part of routine NSS welfare activities. The camp recorded an encouraging response from young scholars who came forward to donate blood.

CAMPUS INFRASTRUCTURE

The college provides separate **common room facilities** for girls and boys. Both rooms provide a recreational space where students can refresh their minds by playing carom table tennis etc.

The building and maintenance subcommittee actively participates in upgrading construction and developmental work. Recent additions to the college infrastructure include a **cycle shed** where students can safely park their bikes, a **corrugated shed** constructed on the terrace to create a space where cultural events or student activities can be hosted and a **solar panel** currently under construction on the roof top which will be an eco-friendly, renewable source of green energy and a newly paved pathway around the garden. The college has a **generator** to ensure a steady power supply in case of power shortage or load shedding thus ensuring smooth running of academic activities.

Sanitary Napkin Vending Machine: A sanitary napkin vending machine was installed in the Girls Common room for maintenance of feminine hygiene and ease and convenience of accessibility. Students may contact any female faculty member of the college for more information.

STUDENT RECREATION

After the reopening of the college campus early in January 2022, **Students Week Celebrations** was planned in accordance to state government directives. The programme schedule, which included an awareness program on Government Scholarships, Poster Competition, Recitation and Dance Competition, Health Check Up had to be cut short due to a surge in Covid cases.



The **College Magazine** entitled “Nabankur” is published annually encouraging students and staff members to submit their essays, art work and creative writing which then undergo a screening process through the magazine committee. Wall magazines are also displayed by various departments showcasing student art works and writings. The 2021-2022 edition of the magazine is available on the college web site.

The **College Annual Sports** is a gala event where students can showcase their athleticism, sportsmanship and team spirit. Last year College Sports was held on the 22nd and the 23rd of December. Some of the key events included Boys 100 Metres Run, Girls 100 Metres Run, long jump, high jump and short put.

A Wall Magazine was published by the Department of Geography on the occasion of World Population Day to raise awareness regarding the alarming rise in population and simultaneous shrinking of vital resources affecting the quality of life.

CAMPUS HIGHLIGHTS

The Department of Geography in collaboration with the IQAC cell, recently organized a **web talk on 'Climate Change'** on the 8th of June, 2022. The web talk was delivered by **Dr Arindam Roy, a scientist at EPFL, Lausanne, Switzerland** and co-founder of Sobuj Prithbi, an initiative to reach out to civilians generating awareness regarding their role in monitoring the impact of climate change at the local and grass-root level.

The Student Credit Card Scheme has been recently introduced by the West Bengal Higher Education Department to enable them to pursue education without any monetary constraints. The scheme which is designed to support students through secondary, higher secondary, undergraduate, postgraduate phases of education by providing financial assistance has been adopted by the college. Dr Soham Pain (Nodal Officer) and Dr Kedar Nath Dey are spearheading the implementation of the scheme to ensure that needy students reap the benefits of the scheme to reach their goals of higher education.

The Department of English offers a short term course in **Spoken English** on an annual basis. The Vice Chancellor of Bankura University and eminent faculty members from various adjoining colleges are invited from time to time to conduct classes. Internal faculty members also offer the necessary guidance and resources to assist students. The course has been temporarily discontinued under the pandemic situation.

A Workshop on the CBCS curriculum was organized by the college governing body on 20.09.2018. It was inaugurated by the Vice-Chancellor of Bankura University. The workshop was conducted to offer a synoptic overview of the syllabus structure for ease of comprehension of teachers as well as students.

A State-Level seminar on Information and Communication Technology was held on 25.04.19. The Vice Chancellor was invited as the keynote speaker. The seminar entitled **“Information and Communication Technology: Its Importance in the Academic and Administrative Arena”** was a deliberation on the effective application of technology in the academic circuit. Other eminent speakers from Bankura and Kolkata also enriched the seminar with their valuable lectures.

An International Webinar entitled “Viral Interventions: Culture and Society in a Post Covid Universe” was organized by the IQAC cell. Inaugurated by the Honorable Vice Chancellor of Bankura University the Webinar engaged with renowned speakers both at the national and international level who reflected on cognitive, pedagogical, social, cultural and infrastructural changes that the post Covid era has witnessed. The college was delighted to have Professor Bashabi Fraser, Edinburgh Napier University and Professor Kalidas Mishra Retired Professor of Sambalpur University amongst its resource persons. Dr Aparna Chakraborty, Joint DPI Education Directorate, Govt of West Bengal also participated in the webinar and delivered a pertinent lecture on pedagogical and methodological changes in the curriculum post-Covid and how we can adapt to the same.

The Football team of the college secured the Runners Up position in the 2nd inter-collegiate football tournament organized by Bankura University.

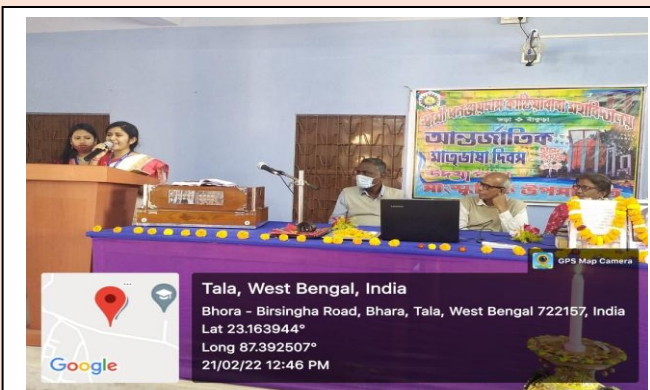

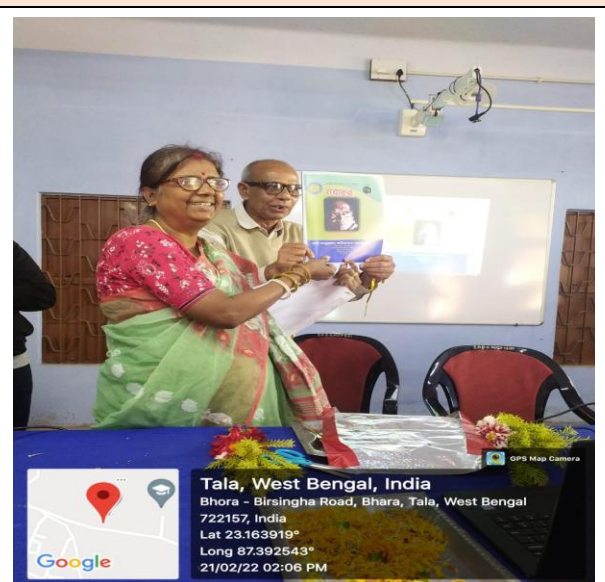
